David Bartlett: David is a Training Officer with the U.S. Department of Education in Kansas City. David has had the privilege to work in the student aid industry for 15 years at the U.S. Department of Education. He has been involved in delivering and developing training at Federal Student Aid (FSA) for nearly 12 years. David is currently working as a team lead on several FSA training development initiatives. David was lucky or unlucky enough to grow up during the 80's and will share these few items... Yes, he had a member's only jacket, wore parachute pants, and no, he never tried break dancing. He even dressed up for a halloween costume party as Don Johnson from *Miami Vice*.

Kathleen Blau: Kathleen is starting her ninth year as Director of Financial Aid at Garden City Community College. She was a high school math teacher and financial institution employee in her "past" life. 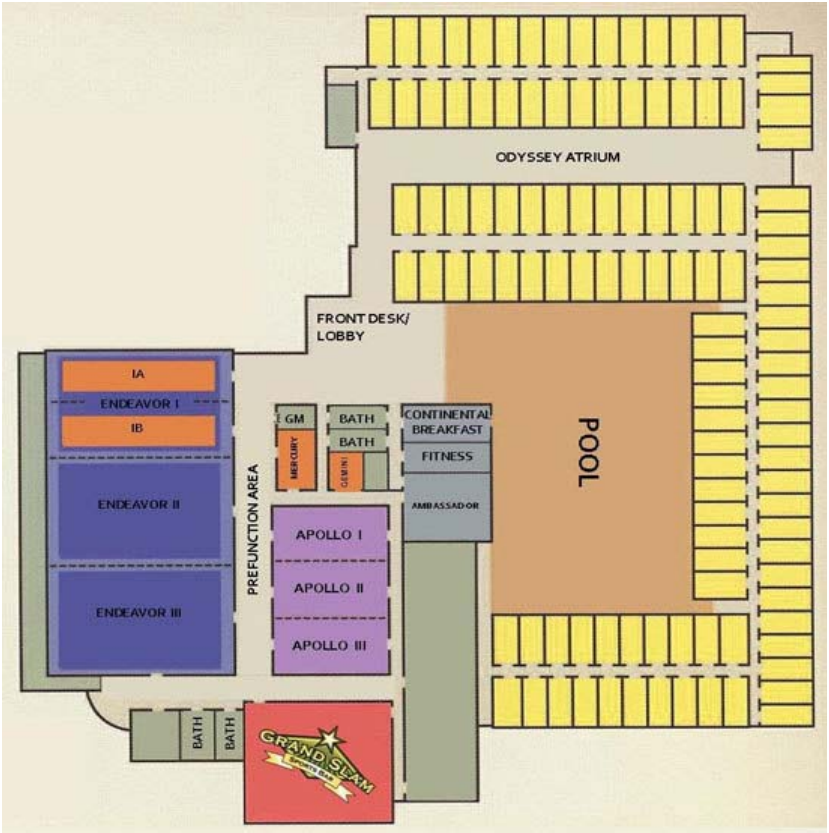
