What Happens Next

- Institution receives application and notifies student.
- Necessary verification documentation must be submitted.
- Institutions may require information specific to their institution.
- Most institutions utilize email so make sure to monitor the email that was on the FAFSA and make sure it is one the student will have access to throughout the year.
- Once the student's file is complete, the institution can determine his/her Federal Student Aid eligibility.
- Offers will be made after eligibility is determined.
